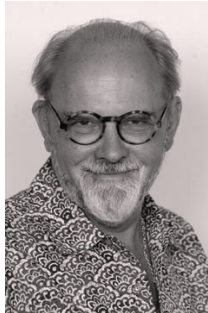


Bob Lockyer Chair
