

Sallis Benney Theatre



Location: University of Brighton, Sallis Benney Theatre, Grand Parade, Brighton, BN2 0JY

Information about the venue*: The Sallis Benney Theatre was built in the 1960s as part of the then Art College and is now part of the University of Brighton. There is wheelchair access with six designated spaces, and all house facilities are fully accessible. There is a maximum capacity of 272 seated and 400 standing. In addition to staging the University Cultural Programme and lectures, the theatre can be used to stage concerts, workshops, show films and conferences. The theatre is situated in a central location five minutes walk from the Brighton train station and a well served bus route.

Accessibility and parking: The Sallis Benney Theatre is fully accessible. The Auditorium has designated wheelchair spaces. There is an infra-red assisted hearing system. Units can be booked by visitors by contacting the venue on tel: 01273 643728. Visitors should check their hearing aid is compatible with the system. A deposit will be required. Guide dogs are welcome.
